WHAT IS A CATARACT?

Cataracts are caused by the natural aging process that occurs inside of the eye. It's a gradual clouding of the eye's clear, natural lens that can, over time, make your vision less sharp.

Symptoms

Cataracts develop slowly and painlessly over time – in fact, in early stages, symptoms may be so mild that you may not even realize your vision is changing. However, as cataracts become more dense, you will experience one or more of the following:

- Blurry or cloudy vision
- Difficulty reading in low light
- Eyeglass prescription changes often, or no longer works
- Poor night vision
- Colors appear dull and washed out
- Halos or glare around lights
